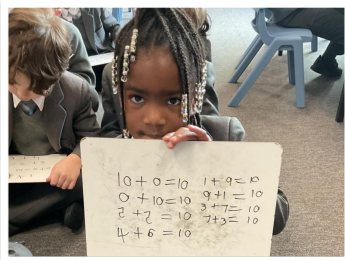


# Weekly Newsletter

## PARENT COUNCIL

A big thank you to all those parents who provided feedback for this weeks Parent Council and particularly to those who joined in person for the meeting.

As we shared in previous newsletters, parental engagement is a key focus for us this year and we are approaching this through the lenses of how the school supports families both academically and pastorally and how school communications ensure positive relationships with parents.

We had a really productive discussion on Wednesday, covering points which included:

- Provision for parents in helping them support their child's learning in mathematics
- Clarification on Home Learning expectations
- Increasing awareness of website content which is designed to support parents in a variety of areas
- The best way to plan and schedule workshops for parents
- Support for parents on the teaching of phonics / early reading including the reading books that are sent home
- Communication about how the school teaches about bullying and responds to potential incidents in school

We will be looking further at these (and other points raised in the meeting) in school and addressing a number of them in upcoming newsletters.

We have recently updated the list of consents that we gather from parents for things like social media and local trips, including the addition of fields for photos / videos.

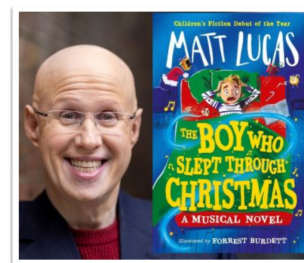
Families can update these consents for their children by following these steps:
