THIS WEEKS ASSEMBLY


In this weeks assembly we shared the beautiful book *Rain Before Rainbows* by Smriti Halls, illustrated by the amazing David Litchfield.

This is a lovely book to share at the start of a new year as it refers to how we all face challenges and hard times but that

these are offset by the rewards and positive experiences that also come our way.

The book also has a really positive message about how we rarely have to deal with difficulties alone because there are always people to guide us along the way.

During the assembly the children came up with some brilliant comments about how the book relates to our character traits including bravery, gratitude and citizenship.



RESPECT

Respect can be a really difficult concept for children to understand and particularly for them then to transfer into actions in their daily lives. It can look different to different people, means a million different things and can be incredibly hard to show, particularly in certain situations!

At CHPS we develop this in a number of ways - being respectful is one of our three school rules and to make it a more concrete idea for the children is discussed regularly when examples are seen in school and also in the books we use when a character may have acted particularly respectfully (or not!) It is also embedded in our curriculum through the UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools Award (for more information on this see our website page here) which encourages the children to appreciate their own rights but crucially also the rights of those around them both locally and across the world.

As whole school examples of respect we also give the children some tangible examples including holding doors open for people, picking up any rubbish they see inside or outside the building and greeting adults when they walk past them. These things alone may not constitute a full definition of respect by a long way but they at least give the children some good examples to start with!

All children have the right to be friends and join or set up clubs, unless this breaks the rights of others.




A TEMPORARY FAREWELL
