CHPS COMMONS AND PUPIL PARLIAMENT UPDATE

One of things we really strive to do at CHPS is nurture our pupils' ability to express their opinions and central to this is our Pupil Parliament programme which is made up of ten pupil groups focusing on aspects such as the environment, digital culture and the arts.

This week we had the excitement of the inaugural 'CHPS Commons', led by our Department for Health and Care. This was a whole school project which took ideas from all classes which were sent to the DHC for shortlisting, resulting in the following proposals...

- The creation of a quiet room for children to use during lunchtimes
- Improvements to the outdoor provision at playtimes
- The creation of a garden / allotment on school grounds
- First Aid training for children

Yesterday, all children involved across every Pupil Parliament group met in the hall for the CHPS Commons session to debate the brilliant shortlisted suggestions and to decide on one for us to take forwards as a whole school initiative.

We were lucky enough to have our local MP Tom Morrison, join us to Chair this and he was absolutely amazed by the enthusiasm and articulation of the children as they discussed the pros and cons of each of the proposals.

After much well mannered wrangling and discussion of some amendments, the Commons voted to move forwards on the idea to introduce some form of First Aid and Mental Health training for pupils. Control of this now goes back to the Department for Health and Care to actualLy put this into action so look out for updates over the next few weeks!











UNIFORM UPDATE

Over the next year and a half, we will be phasing in some small changes to the school uniform, including the blazer and polo shirts. We have worked with our suppliers to source a blazer which is cheaper than the current version, is non-gender specific and is more ethical environmentally.

The new items are likely to be available for purchase from September of this year but children will be able to continue to wear the current uniform over the 2025-26 year as a transitionary period.
