END OF TERM ASSESSMENTS

At the end of each term at CHPS, Class Teachers conduct assessments with the children to gain a standardised snapshot of how they are currently performing in reading, writing and maths. The children are in the process of completing this and in the final fortnight of term, Class Teachers will sit down with members of the Senior Leadership Team to review what these assessments are telling us, and what more we can do to ensure all pupils have what they need to succeed this year.

The outcomes of these assessments will be shared with you all before the end of term and you will have the chance to discuss these, along with your child's broader progress in school, in our second Parents' Evenings of the year which will be taking place on 22nd & 23rd January (details on booking these will be shared at the start of next term).

It is important to note that the most important form of assessment Class Teachers do is during daily lessons to ensure their teaching is always adapting to pupil needs. With this in mind, we would always say that if you ever feel the need to discuss your child's progress, to get in touch and we will be happy to arrange a conversation.
