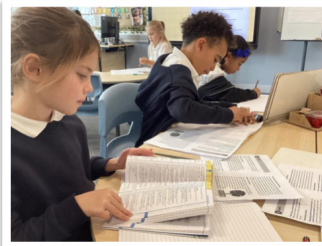
## UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD: THE BEBRAS CHALLENGE

In Autumn 2 Mr Coyle will be running a lunchtime club where children will take part in The Bebras Challenge.

This event is designed to introduce computational thinking to children. It is organised by the Raspberry Pi Foundation in partnership with the University of Oxford. Last year over 3 million students took part!

The challenge will be open to all children in Years 3-6 and is a series of interactive tasks designed to encourage logical thinking and problem-solving skills.
